Structure, Governance & Management

The Clinical Human Factors Group is an independent campaign group managed by a board of Trustees, which aims to stimulate dialogue and demonstrates through concrete action how a better understanding of the role of human factors can have a significant impact on safety, quality and productivity of health.

Trustees are appointed at the Annual General Meeting of the Clinical Human Factors Group. Trustees retire from office at this meeting by rotation based on length of service as trustees. Trustees who have retired can be reappointed if the vacancy has not been filled.

The board of trustees consist of healthcare professionals, managers, service users, services experts.

The Trustees operate under its Charity Trust Deed.

Objectives and Activities - Public benefit

The Clinical Human Factors Group will work for the advancement of education among Healthcare Staff (including managers, policy makers and allied hospital staff) of Clinical Human Factors so as to directly preserve and protect public health.

The Trustees of Clinical Human Factors Group present their report for year ending 31st March 2013.

Achievements and Performance

Throughout the year the CHFG has remained true to its mission of promoting an understanding of human factors in healthcare.

Our work has continued around our three manifesto goals; Promoting human factors education and training, building high reliability organisations and promoting intelligent regulation and independent investigation.

We ran our fourth successful "Open Seminar" at Addenbrookes Hospital in Cambridge sharing the latest knowledge and developments in human factors in healthcare. The groundwork for the 5th seminar (scheduled for mid-2013) was started.

The CHFG website www.chfg.org was maintained as a source of useful information and contacts. CHFG members were kept in touch with developments in human factors in healthcare via E-newsletters and blogs.

Trustees and advocates were key contributors to the Francis Report and to a Department of Health Human Factors Reference Group.

We provided advice on human factors safety science to the General Medical Council and Nursing and Midwifery Council and supported the National Quality Board with expertise around Human Factors. Trustees and advocates gave expert input to help the development of the Horizon Television Programme 'How to avoid mistakes in surgery'

CHFG also started the development of several resources for Boards and frontline workers:

- a) 'Implementing human factors in healthcare Taking further steps' How to Guide Volume 2
- b) Case studies and Implementation Tips (A5 guide)
- c) Getting to grips with the human factor Strategic actions for safer care.

The coming year will provide further opportunities for human factors to be embedded in healthcare and we plan to become more focussed on areas where we can have the biggest impact on our three manifesto aims.

Reserves Policy
